1. Entrants must be a member of a CTF sanctioned youth league or bowl in a youth league and an adult league, and must have participated in at least two-thirds (2/3rds) of the youth schedule at the time of bowling in order to bowl in a CTF youth tournament. Exceptions are available to bowlers who are out of province due to an education commitment, provided they purchase a CTF membership and bowl for their province of residence. Achievement recognition will be provided as per CTF Playing Rules. For a complete review of CTF youth tournament eligibility, including situations not covered herein, refer to the CTF Playing Rulebook, rule 300d4.
2. This tournament is sanctioned by the Canadian Tenpin Federation and shall be governed by all CTF rules.
3. Entry closing date is **January 14, 2020**. Entries received after that date will only be accepted at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

6. This tournament will be conducted in eight (8) divisions, consisting of separate boys' and girls' divisions in each of the following age ranges. (Ages are taken as of August 1, 2019.)

Bantam	11 and under	August 2, 2007 or later
Junior	12 to 14 years	August 2, 2004 – August 1, 2007
Intermediate	15 to 17 years	August 2, 2001 – August 1, 2004
Senior	18 to 21 years	August 2, 1997 – August 1, 2001

7. No tournament re-entries will be permitted.
8. The top six (6) boy and girl in each division will advance to Round 2 Matchplay.
9. The qualifying will consist of six (6) games bowled, three (3) games on one pair, and then three (3) games on a different pair. The lanes are determined randomly upon entry and may not be changed.
10. Winners will be determined by the total combined scratch scores for all six (6) games.
11. In the event of a tie for the final advancement position, one complete game shall be bowled. Subsequent ties shall be broken in the same manner. If a bowler is not present for a roll-off within 15 minutes of when it is scheduled to start they will forfeit their spot.

13. Award fees will be returned 100% to the bowlers.



14. During the competition, competitors are expected to keep a watch on their scores. Any errors should immediately be brought to the lane runner's attention. If the lane runner cannot correct the problem, a tournament official will make the decision. Failing this; the Tournament Director will make the binding decision. Bowlers must be ready to bowl when it is their turn. Bowlers may not leave the bowling area without alerting a tournament official. Zero will be counted for all frames missed.
15. Drugs, stimulants or liquor will not be tolerated at any times, unless otherwise authorized by the Tournament Director. Prescription drugs that have to be used will be cleared through the coach or tournament official before competition starts. Should this infraction occur the bowler will be IMMEDIATELY disqualified.
16. No smoking of any kind (tobacco, e-cigarettes, etc.) will be permitted during tournament play or at any official function by bowling competitors.
17. Food or refreshments shall not be allowed in the bowling area.
18. Proper attire is required. Shirts must have sleeves and be free of obscene graphics or lettering etc. Jeans, pants, shorts, skirts must not have any noticeable holes. No headgear, including music players, track pants, pajama pants, or halter tops are to be worn. The Tournament Director reserves the right to disqualify any bowler not wearing suitable attire after reasonable opportunity to change has been given.
19. A current youth league standing sheet must be submitted with entry showing pinfall and number of games bowled. **Do not send individual record sheets, or standing sheets from adult leagues!**
20. Participants shall not be allowed to leave the bowling establishment during any portion of competition.
21. Poor sportsmanship, abusive language, or abuse of bowling equipment will not be tolerated at any time and could result in a one (1) frame penalty a tournament official on the next frame. Bowlers are expected to abide by the fundamental rules of good sportsmanship. All CTF rules will be adhered to and any violation of the rules could result in immediate disqualification.
22. Any protest must be filed in writing with the Tournament Director within thirty (30) minutes of completion of the event under protest.
23. You must report immediately to a tournament official any unusual incident or medical problem.
24. Practice will be for a maximum of ten (10) minutes prior to the start of the shift. There will be no practice after the bowlers change lanes for the second set of three (3) games.
25. In the event of an injury to a competitor during competition, the Tournament Director shall decide if a short delay is warranted. A bowler unable to return to competition shall receive a score of zero (0) for the remaining frames.
26. All posted rules will be in effect. Rules not covered here will use CTF rules. Any situations not covered by the rules will be at the Tournament Director's discretion.

6. This tournament will be conducted in eight (8) divisions, consisting of separate boys' and girls' divisions in each of the following age ranges. (Ages are taken as of August 1, 2019.)

7. The top three (3) boys and girls in each age division will be awarded scholarships, as well as Gold, Silver, and Bronze Medallions.
8. The eight (8) Gold medal winners will also receive a banner, and will be the Southern Ontario team at the Canadian Youth Championships
9. The qualifying will consist of five (5) games of matchplay. Each bowler will be matched against every other bowler in their division exactly once, changing lanes after every game.
10. Each match winner is determined by scratch scores. Two (2) points are awarded for a win and one (1) point awarded for a tie. Zero (0) points are awarded for a loss. Additionally, points will be awarded based on a "beat the field" scoring system. For each game bowled in each division six (6) points will be awarded for the top scratch score, five (5) for the next best scratch score, four (4) points for the third best score and continuing on down to one (1) point being awarded for the bottom score. In the event of a scratch score tie(s), the points for the positions in questions will be added together and divided by the number of tied bowlers. For example, if there was a tie for second place, the second place and third place points (5 and 4 respectively) would be added together and divided by two. In this case each bowler would receive 4.5 points
11. Winners will be determined by total combined points over the five (5) games.
12. In the event of a tie for any medal position, one complete game shall be bowled with the scores determining order of finish. Subsequent ties shall be broken in the same manner. If a bowler is



not present for a roll-off within 15 minutes of when it is scheduled to start they will forfeit their spot.

13. Award fees will be returned 100% to the bowlers.
14. During the competition, competitors are expected to keep a watch on their scores. Any errors should immediately be brought to the lane runner's attention. If the lane runner cannot correct the problem, a tournament official will make the decision. Failing this; the Tournament Director will make the binding decision. Bowlers must be ready to bowl when it is their turn. Bowlers may not leave the bowling area without alerting a tournament official. Zero will be counted for all frames missed.

19. Prior to competition and between matches you are expected to remain in the bowling area and cheer other competitors on. Entrants shall not be allowed to leave the bowling establishment during any portion of competition.
20. Poor sportsmanship, abusive language, or abuse of bowling equipment will not be tolerated at any time and could result in a one (1) frame penalty a tournament official on the next frame. Bowlers are expected to abide by the fundamental rules of good sportsmanship. All CTF rules will be adhered to and any violation of the rules could result in immediate disqualification.
21. Any protest must be filed in writing with the Tournament Director within thirty (30) minutes of completion of the event under protest.
22. You must report immediately to a tournament official any unusual incident or medical problem.
